The European Reformations Wednesdays in May from 7-8 PM in the Fireside Room

Join Pastor Andy in this high-level lecture-style class that will delve into the history of the European Reformations and explore the time period from the early 1400s to the late 1600s.

The class will be based on the excellent textbook The European Reformations by Carter Lindberg. You can purchase and read the book if you wish, but the class will be accessible without the book. Handouts will be provided and there will be time for your questions.

While some time will be dedicated to Martin Luther and the Lutheran Reformation, much attention will be given to the Swiss, Genevan, English, and other Reformations that have led to the Presbyterian, Congregational, Anglican / Episcopal, and other Christian Church bodies and the individual work of Huldrych Zwingli, John Calvin, English reformers, and others.
