First, a disclaimer. As a man I'm not qualified to say what mothering or motherhood is, but I want to try to put it in words as I've had the privilege to experience, witness, watch, and be in awe of mothers and mothering. So this is my flawed attempt to honor God's gift of mothering today.



Mothering is a sacrifice. It's the seemingly unanswered prayers to conceive, exhaustion and nausea of pregnancy, the time spent switching out a wardrobe of clothing, the bodily scars, the risks of complications, the feeding, pumping, and constant care. It's making plans to celebrate accomplishments and the joy of, as someone once said, having pieces of your heart running around in the world.

Today we thank God for mothers, motherhood, and mothering. We celebrate with all who celebrate today, we grieve with all who grieve, and we point to hope in God's ongoing, mothering love.
