All summer long we had 7 young people with various disabilities join us for a Baker's Apprenticeship. This

was done in partnership with Valley Friendship Club in Stillwater. We paired each apprentice with a volunteer and together they measured and mixed and kneaded various bread doughs. We also produced cookies and peeled loads of apples for Hoppel Poppel's famous 'Normandy Apple Bread'! We cleaned dough buckets and mixing bowls, sold our products at local farmer's markets and gained the dignity of work inclusion.

We are grateful to you for allowing us to cover the kitchen with flour every week and for welcoming everybody, of all abilities!
